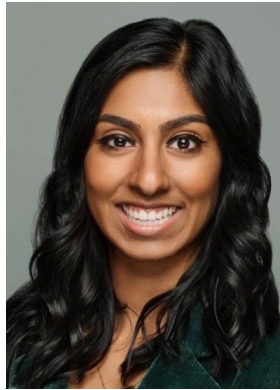


Shalini Ray
